Welcome to March! The Belted Galloway Society held the Spring Council Meeting in New Glarus, Wisconsin during the month of February. After my visit to Wis-

consin, I am whole-heartedly, one hundred percent certain, that this Texan will never retire to any location north of the Mason Dixon line. I salute all of my fellow cattlemen and women who raise cattle during the winter months, and work daily in freezing temperatures, snow, and ice!

I want to recognize long-time breeder and friend to many, Michelle Ogle of Bedminster, New Jersey. Most recently, Michelle served as a member of the executive team, as our president from 2014 through 2015, and the chairperson of the show/sale committees. Actually, she has served our breed for over two decades with (two) two -terms on Council and in many capacities. Her knowledge, expertise, and work ethic on behalf of our breed is amazing. We really cannot thank her enough for her dedication! With Michelle's retirement on Council, she made the decision to retire from the show/sale committees too. She has promised me that she will help me with a smooth transition as I move into the role as chair-person. The rest of the show/sale committee members have rolled up their sleeves to work together.

We spent a lot of time discussing the show/sale committee recommendations at the Spring Council meeting. Belted Galloway exhibitors can expect updated national show rules. We are also planning the 2018 Annual General Meeting and the Premium Sale during the North

American International Livestock Exposition, in Louisville, Kentucky during November. The Premium Sale will transition into a live sale too. Executive Director Vic Eggleston and I will be traveling to Louisville in March to meet with the NAILE administration.

It is important to note that Michelle Ogle has worked over two decades to help us exhibit our breed at the NAILE. Because we are now in Freedom Hall on the green shavings, it is like winning the Super Bowl for the exposure it brings to our breed.

Albert Einstein once said, 'There are two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle.' It is a miracle that our breed has stood the test of time and grown in numbers because of the crossbreeding of cattle for commercial markets over the past fifty years in the United States. Our breed continues to take a "hit" in commercial markets across the country because it apparently is still a secret about the quality of the meat under the belted hide. We have work to do! Sell your finished steers privately. Belong to your beef associations. Attend local, regional, and national meetings. Network among Belted Galloway breeders. Market your cattle as purebred and register them. Do not discount them. Be positive!

I recently visited a farm of Belted Galloway cattle in the Midwest. As I turned to go down the road they lived on, I saw another herd of black cattle. It was a cold, windy, snowy day and they stood together hunched over. As I arrived at the Belted Galloway farm, I observed soggybellied, bred females in the pastures eating hay, oblivious to the weather conditions. Hmm – where are the commercial cattlemen when I need to teach them something?

The 2018 Spring Council Meeting

The Spring Council meeting was called to order at 8:15 a.m. February 17, 2018 in New Glarus, WI by President Dawson Masters (TX). Present were Jack Bagley (VA) Jon Bednarski (KY), Randy Hall (ME), Past President Greg Hipple (IA), Vice-President Janie Tripp (MS), Dick Williams (SC). Also present was Executive Director Victor Eggleston (WI). Leanne Fogle (IL) represented the newsletter office. Absent: Mike Crittenden (UT), Keith Jones (SC).

Secretary's Report. Vic Eggleston communicated that membership totals during 2017 were 891 Regular, 144 Junior, 11 Associate, and 139 Life. Total memberships during 2017 were 1,185. The 2017 registration/transfer data included 317 Males, 1,214 Purebred Females, 116 Appendix/Percentage Females and 1,084 Transfers. Total transactions were 2,731.

Treasurer's Report. Vic Eggleston reported the Society has \$43,466 in checking, \$10,895 in savings, and \$136,110 in a certificate of deposit. Society assets total \$190,471.

President's Report. President Masters welcomed everyone to New Glarus. He conducted a special vote to replace an open position on Council. Dick Williams (SC) was nominated and Council voted to approve the nomination. Council also approved Greg Hipple acting as Secretary during 2018. Masters requested that all Council members introduce themselves in upcoming issues of the *US Beltie News*.

Promotion and Advertising Committee. Belted Galloway cattle were featured in the magazine Acreage Life and the Society paid to advertise in the magazine. Council requested that Bednarski inquire about publishing in digital venues like Steer Planet or Breeders World. Bednarski also presented a proposed agenda for the six-day 2020 World Galloway Congress meeting to be held in Louisville, KY. Council approved funding for the event. Bednarski will establish a website dedicated to the World Galloway Congress. The committee is seeking editorials to produce the 2018 Belted Galloway Journal. More magazines will be printed in 2018 because of the demand for Belted Galloway print materials.

Chatfield Scholarship Committee. Vic Eggleston reported that applications are due at the end of April 2018. Council recommended that scholarships should be awarded at the completion of the of the fall semester.

Executive Committee. The contracts for the offices of the Executive Director and Newsletter were reviewed. Council approved the budgeted recommendations.

The Belted Galloway Foundation. Michelle Ogle is president of the Belted Galloway Foundation and a meeting will be held soon. Total Foundation funds: \$49,136.41. Individu-

al fund balances include: General Fund: \$14,219.25; Scholarship: \$16,073.33; Junior: \$18,843.83.

Newsletter Committee. In November 2017, Lakes Marketing and Print in Spirit Lake, Iowa began printing the *US Beltie News* with improved customer service, turn-around times, and better quality of printed materials. Council approved Chairman Leanne Fogle's request to drop the fee for placing a photo in the classified section of beltie.org. In 2017, 117 ads were placed on beltie.org by member farms. Fogle also has been tracking the success rate of animals sold on beltie.org and in the *US Beltie News* by surveying member farms who advertise. Council will review the results during the 2018 fall meeting. Individual animal pedigrees are now linked from the CLRC site to the classifieds on beltie.org as an added benefit for potential buyers. A new schedule for editorial was implemented in January. All editorial must reach the newsletter office by the 20th of each month.

Sale. Council accepted the request by Dawson Masters on behalf of the committee to hold a live Premium Sale in Louisville during 2018. Council also approved contracting with Larry Martin Livestock to conduct the sale. The Belted Galloway Society will rent the sale arena. Council agreed to wave the requirement that sale animals must be shown at NAILE during 2018.

Show. The committee looked over the national show rules and made recommendations to Council regarding the rules. Council approved the changes. Dawson Masters will discuss the changes with the NAILE in March. The rules will be published in April 2018. Council approved new reporting rules for the Belted Galloway Society show point system. Points must be reported within 30 days of the event to the Executive Director's office. All animals must be listed. The list should include placing and exhibitor. All animals listed must include sire, dam, and registration numbers on the show report for points to be awarded.

Budget and Finance. Council approved the 2018 budget.

Old Business. Council approved posting on the CLRC website hypotrichosis results on any bull born January 1, 2018 or later. ET bulls are not exempt from hypotrichosis testing, even if parents are negative. For any bulls that are hypotrichosis tested and DNA tested born prior to January 1, 2018, registration fees will be reduced to \$30.

New Business. Council assigned the development of a Belted Galloway APP for smart phone use to the Information and Technology Committee. Council approved holding the annual meeting in Louisville, Kentucky during 2018. Council also approved holding the spring meeting 2019 in Fredericksburg, Texas.

This is a summary of committee reports at the Council meeting of the Belted Galloway Society. The official minutes are on file with the Executive Director.

A.H. Chatfield Jr. Memorial Scholarship

The 2018 A. H. Chatfield, Jr., Memorial Scholarship applications are available. Three \$1000 scholarships are awarded annually. Forms may be requested from Executive Director, Victor Eggleston, Phone (608) 220-1091; email: executivedirector@beltie.org or may be accessed at www.beltie.org.

The recipients must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a member of the Belted Galloway Junior Association, the Belted Galloway Society Inc., or be a child or grand-child of a BGS member:
 - 2. Be either a graduating high school senior or a college student, or be enrolled in an advanced education program;
- 3. Submit the completed application form along with a written essay explaining why you are the best possible candidate for the scholarship. Added consideration will be given to applicants enrolled in animal/agriculture-related courses, and those experienced with Belted Galloway cattle. Extracurricular and out-of-school activities will also be taken into consideration.

Completed applications must be submitted to Executive Director, Victor Eggleston, N8603 Zentner Rd., New Glarus, WI 53574, and must be postmarked by April 30, 2018.

Lease Agreements

- 1. A lease agreement must be on file with the CLRC by July 1, 2018 for animals to be shown under the lessee's name.
- 2. Exhibitor points will be awarded to the lessee of the animal.
- 3. If animal is shown under the lessee one day of a multiple day show, the animal must continue to be exhibited under the lessee for the duration of the entire show. The lease cannot be terminated halfway through an event. The owner of the leased animal may used the animal for group classes.
- 4. Lease fees are waived for juniors members.

2018 Mandatory Testing Requirements

All bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be DNA and hypotrichosis tested before registration. Fees for the mandatory DNA and hypotrichosis testing are \$65. The Executive Director's office will generate the paperwork for samples to be submitted to UC Davis.

Bulls born on January 1, 2018 or after, may be registered with the CLRC for \$30 after the DNA and hypotrichosis testing are completed. Council reduced the registration fee to \$30 for all bulls born on January 1, 2018 or after to accommodate the mandatory testing.

The Executive Director's office will notify the breeder with the test results and an authorization for registration.

Bulls born before January 1, 2018 are not required to be DNA or hypotrichosis tested and fees for registration will remain \$50.

About bulls ... Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We should have data available on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 16 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.






