many of you know, there will not be a SALE this year as part of the Louisville activities.

The Society's Annual Meeting will be held on Monday, November 14th at 7 pm at the Exposition Center. We are exploring whether there is sufficient internet bandwidth to attempt to provide online access, but this is to be determined still.

I realize continuing COVID-19 concerns and transportation costs will enter into your decision making, but I hope there will be good attendance not only for the Annual Meeting but also for both the Open and Junior Show. Given the uncertainty of people traveling, we will not reserve a block of rooms at any of the nearby hotels; everyone can make their own housing decisions.

The complete NAILE schedule is featured in this newsletter for your reference. We are working hard to get sponsors for the banners for the various class winners. If anyone is interested, please let Dawson or Corinna know.

There has been some confusion on the effective date of our show rule changes. Dawson Masters, Chair of the current Show Committee, led in an effort in 2021 to maintain some consistency among all the references that existed for shows and eligibility for financial support from the Society as well as Show Point Awards. The updated rules for BGS supported shows were approved by the Council at its meeting on April 23rd, 2022 and were posted on the Beltie website in mid-June of 2022.

It is the responsibility of each show manager to ensure that these rules are enforced in order to be eligible for financial support and points; neither the Executive Director nor the Council can oversee this process for each show.

Two other quick items:

The Council has decided to publish the Beltie Journal again this year. Please support Jayde Reilly in her efforts to obtain sponsors and feature stories. The Journal is an important piece for promotion and advertising.

The Council will have two vacancies for the upcoming election process. As a result of some extenuating circumstances involving the nominating Committee membership at the present time, we are going to ask each Regional organization to offer a candidate.

Individuals in other parts of the country who are interested can also submit their names for the ballot that will be published in a future edition of the newsletter.

FARM TECHNOLOGY DAYS

The 2022 Wisconsin Farm Technology Days was held July 12 - 14, 2022 at Dennis

and Suzie Roehl family's farm, Roehl Acres, in Loyal, Wisconsin. Roehl Acres has over 500 registered dairy cattle and crops 750 acres. Also participating was Rustic Occasions, an event barn operated by cousins Doug and Kim Roehl up the road from the farm. To help celebrate Wisconsin's premier agricultural technology show, Farm Tech Fest was held Wednesday night with Joe Nichols and Sawyer Brown performing before a sold-out audience. Event organizers say it takes around 3 years of planning and 1,500 volunteers to make it all happen.

The show featured 600+ exhibitors, tour and field demonstrations, farm tours, and more. With near perfect weather the crowd swelled to a reported 46,084 people attending the three-day event. One popular feature of the show was The Beef Tent showcasing several different breeds of cattle, including Belted Galloways. Large crowds viewed TEK Cattle's cow-calf pair and an impressive GLBGA display hosted by Terry and Karlyn Etheridge (TEK Cattle) along with Talya and Bill Purdon (Patriot's Pasture). The display was an inviting stop for many people interested in learning more about the breed.

Plans are well underway for next year's show to be held July 18 – 20, 2023 at the Baraboo Steam and Gas Engine Grounds, in Baraboo, W/

DR. VIC EGGLESTON AWARDED JANE FAUL AWARD

Greg Hipple (IA) and Jayde Reilly (WI) presented former BGS Executive Director, Dr. Victor Eggleston (WI) with the Jane Faul Service Award on July 29th, 2022.

The Belted Galloway Society's Council established The Jane Service Faul Award during 2014 to commemorate the memory of the late Jane Faul from Battletown. Kentucky. Jane was a Belted Galloway breeder, Council member, and Society contractor who worked tirelessly for over two decades to promote the Belted Galloway breed. The presentation of the award celebrates her spirit of dedication and commitment. Past president Marlin Sherbine explained Jane's service to the breed: I have served on a lot of boards and belonged to many organizations and I have never encountered anyone so energized or devoted to a single cause and

to the Belted Galloway breed. The Jane Faul Service Award will not be annual, but presented from time-to-time by the Executive Director and Newsletter offices to a member who has shown outstanding support and service in the administration of the Belted Galloway Society.

KEEPING PROPER HERD RECORDS

The newcomer to cattle husbandry hears often that good records are a must. But sometimes it takes a little research to learn what to record. Here's a sample form that is adequate and is available online under 'Records' at www.beltie.org. You may use it as a guide to design your own, or more comprehensive forms that are not difficult to use may be obtained from your county extension agent. In general, you'll want to record the calf production for each cow, make notations on calving ease or difficulty, and keep track of health issues and immunizations.

You will want to record the birth date and weight of each calf. The calf's weight should be recorded again at 205 days of age, and at 365 days. Weighing may be accomplished with a scale or by measuring the heart girth with a tape marked to indicate the beef animal's approximate weight.

Calving ease is indicated by:

- 1--No difficulty, no assistance. 2--Minor difficulty, some assistance. 3--Major difficulty, pulling required. 4--Caesarian birth.
- 5--Abnormal birth.

The cow's condition score is indicated by:

1-2 -- Very thin. 3-4 -- Thin. 5-6 - Good condition. 7-8 - Over-conditioned. 9 - Significantly over-conditioned.

SOCIETY SANCTIONED SHOW RULES

- 1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
- 2. Animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
- Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
- Original registration or recordation will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
- Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear nose rings, either temporary or permanent, and must have a lead attached to the ring whenever being led.
- All bulls shown must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
- 7. Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a bull soundness exam.
- Females that are 26 mos. or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months or older must show in cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing.
- Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers and Purebred, mismarked heifers. Mismarked heifers will not be eligible for Supreme Drive
- 10. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show which would include percentage heifers and steers.
- 11. Percentage heifers and steers may not be shown in group classes.
- 12. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls and group classes, followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred, mis-marked heifers and percentage heifers. Group classes:
 - Only purebred, Belted Galloways can be shown in group classes, no percentage animals, purebred steers are allowed.
 - There will be 3 group classes, Get of Sire, (3 animals by one sire) Produce of Dam, (2 animals by one dam), and Best Four Head which will consist of 4 animals represented in any configuration. All animals shown in group must have shown in previous classes
 - All animals shown in the best 4 head group class must be owned or co-owned by exhibitor at least 30 days prior to show.
- 13. All Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals shall be DNA verified at the Society's expense.
- 14. To compete in the Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. No bulls over 7 months of age may be used in Junior Showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the Judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
- 15. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions must be made by the late entry deadline of the show. Substitutions may be made within class only.
- 16. The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or split classes depending upon total entries in the class.
- 17. The Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injections of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation; any additions of artificial tail heads or polls; any surgical alteration of the animal's shape; as well as any dyeing or coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping or drenching) is strictly prohibited.
- 18. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
- 19. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show Committee. Cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
- 20. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
- 21. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
- 22. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc., and of the show they are attending, or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall not be allowed back the next year.
- 23. Exhibitors Timeslots for set up will be communicated to Exhibitors.
- 24. Unattended animals must be double tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.
