

#### **Other Reminders**

Please be sure to take the time to read through our educational article in this issue about hypotrichosis. Hypotrichosis testing is required for all bulls born after January 1, 2018 AND all donor females and embryo calves. While we do require testing for those situations, breeders can request testing for any of their animals regardless of age or sex to help them make informed breeding decisions. Hypotrichosis testing is \$30. Another page to take note of is the page that mentions terminology. With our move to Digital Beef we will see each animal noted with a classification. Classifications will be either fullblood, purebred or percentage. Because of this difference in the terminology I am asking the Long Term Planning Committee to look at implementing correct terminology in our Breeder's Manual, among others.

JOYCE L. EGGLESTON - NEW GLARUS, WI



Joyce L Eggleston, 82, the "herdsman" of Hav-A-Belt Galloway's she and her husband Dr Victor Eggleston ran for over 20 years passed away Monday October 7, 2024 while in the care of Highview at the Woodlands Nursing Center in Rockton, II. Born March 12, 1942 in Howell, MI, Joyce served as Dairy Princess the year she graduated from Howell High School in 1960. Joyce attended and graduated with a Bachelors of Arts in Secondary Education from Michigan State University after which she taught business education in Fowlerville, MI. Joyce was united in marriage to Victor L. Eggleston March 12, 1963.

Joyce and Vic are parents of two daughters, Debra (Stephen) Aisenbrey, and Amy (Brian) Culpepper, and Grandparents of Kitara, Bailee, and Grant.

Known to many Belted Galloway Breeders as the First Lady of the breed, Joyce was as dedicated to her beloved cattle as any one person could be. A trusted and dedicated adviser and friend to many, Joyce gave of her time and talents in several instances over the last several decades. A long-time member of the World Beef Expo organization, serving as beef superintendent, the Wisconsin Cattle Women, Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association, Belted Galloway Society Council, serving in leadership capacities in all of these organizations. Joyce also gave of her time and talents as a leader of Sheboygan County 4-H in the Horse Program and the Youth Building. She served as the Chair of the Belted Galloway Society Scholarship Committee which earned her a seat on the Belted Galloway Foundation. Joyce served as the official

host and assistant to our First Executive Director Dr Vic Eggleston for 12 years. Joyce's service to the Belted Galloway Breed culminated in her being presented the Harry T Burn award at the Annual Meeting of the Belted Galloway Society at the World Beef Expo in September 2017.

Partial to her Dun Belties, Joyce had a keen eye for well conformed, hardy cattle. She always made visitors and potential customers, especially newcomers to the breed feel welcome and valued. Her advice and counsel regarding many of the challenges we all face in this lifestyle of production agriculture, raising Belted Galloway Cattle, families, and even our pets were sought out and truly valued. Her common-sense, direct approach to many of life's challenges was refreshing and appreciated.

Joyce is survived by her Husband of 61 years, her daughters, their husbands and 3 grandchildren, two brothers Harold (Kathy) Peckens and Bruce (Cathy) Peckens; numerous nieces, nephews and cousins and leaves behind a plethora of admiring friends and neighbors. She was preceded in death by her parents and a sister Lois.









## IN MEMORY OF

DWIGHT A. HOWARD - UNION, ME



Dwight Angelo Howard, of Union, Maine, passed away peacefully early Monday morning September 23, 2024 with his wife Nancy by his side after a brief illness.

Dwight was born on September 17, 1932 to Dorothy and Angelo Howard in Union, ME. The family farmed their land with Dorothy operating an assisted living service for elderly adults in their home while Angelo performed a variety of construction jobs including swinging a 16 pound hammer breaking rock for a number of years.

Following his service in the Army, he married Nancy Messer and together began their own farm career. Dwight worked a variety of jobs including a stint as a Guard at the Maine State Prison on nights which afforded him the ability to work his farm during the days. He raised beef cattle and raised squash on their farm when a life changing opportunity arose when he was recruited to be Farm Manager at Aldermere Farm in Rockport, ME.

Aldermere Farm, at that time, was the oldest original herd of Belted Galloways in the United States. Working with owner Albert Chatfield Jr., they researched genetics, improved fields and feed crops and built what became known as the most outstanding herd in the United States, if not the world. Dwight took cattle to the annual National Shows and often won Grand Champions with Aldermere's cattle. They sold cattle to farms all over the country but also imported and exported cattle internationally. This international recognition led Dwight to be asked to come to both Scotland and Australia to judge their own National Belted Galloway shows. In 2001, the United States Belted Galloway society recognized him for his outstanding leadership and support for the growth of the breed throughout the United States.

Closer to home, Dwight served as Livestock Superintendent at the Union Fair and served as President of the Maine State Beef Producers including being inducted into their Hall of Fame. Dwight's activities outside of work continued to be some hunting and fishing but he also served in the Rockport Boosters Club that for one project included building a skating rink in what is now the "swamp" across from the old Rockport Elementary school for kids and families to enjoy. He also served as a 4H Club Leader and a Little League Baseball Coach.

In retirement, Dwight and Nancy took camping trips across the country including one to Alaska that remained their favorite. They also for nearly 40 years took camping trips to Florida and then purchased a place there in Venice where they still have many dear friends.

Once a farmer always a farmer, Dwight and Nancy cared for and maintained a large vegetable garden even this year and maintained a fenced pasture next to the house so that a local farm would have a place to graze their Belted Galloways, keeping the breed close to his home and heart.



## HYPOTRICHOSIS

#### IN BELTED GALLOWAY CATTLE

Many breeds of cattle are afflicted with a number of genetic conditions. But thanks to modern research and scientific developments, identifying the specific gene that causes each of these abnormalities has become a reality. Belted Galloway breeders report the intermittent calf born exhibiting varying degrees of hair loss or hypotrichosis symptoms.

Manifestations of hypotrichosis are evident at birth or within 72 hours of birth. Generally hair loss at pressure/rub points at the joints of the inner legs followed by the additional hair loss on the legs and the belt. Regrowth of hair and the subsequent loss has been noted in some animals held past weaning age. On rare occasions, excessive hoof growth has been noted, elongated bodies, unusual head shapes, or belowaverage growth rates.

Through the scientific research of Dr. Jonathan Beever PhD at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, the hypotrichosis (HY) recessive gene in the Belted Galloway breed was identified. Dr. Beever developed an accurate diagnostic test for the identification of the gene. Belted Galloway breeders contributed to Dr. Beever's research by submitting blood/semen samples of many symptomatic animals that included dams/sires that were suspected carriers of the hypotrichosis (HY) recessive gene. Also, whole herd samplings were volunteered for genetic diversity in the study. As a minor breed of cattle, with limited means, we are grateful that Dr. Beever was willing to invest his expertise and resources to identify the hypotrichosis (HY) gene. Sample testing was done through batch processing requiring 30+ individual blood/semen samples to be submitted in order to process testing Over time, our breeders began to make requests for the availability to process an individual sample (HY) results could be expedited when the information was time sensitive.

UC Davis, the provider of the laboratory services that verify DNA parentage for the Belted Galloway breed, confirmed that they will offer hypotrichosis testing on a per sample basis with the submission of hair, blood, or semen. As an added bonus, Belted Galloway breeders have the option to test an animal for DNA parentage and hypotrichosis with the same sample submitted.

The results of those animals that were hypotrichosis tested through Dr. Beever's research have been used as a management tool to make informed breeding decisions. By identifying (HY) carriers through official testing, breeders have avoided producing (HY) calves by not mating (HY) carrier cattle.

Tom and Pete, two Belted Galloway breeders, shared their past hypotrichosis experience. Tom had been a breeder of Belted Galloway cattle for 20 years. He purchased a bull from Pete—a breeder who had genetics that Tom felt would be beneficial in his breeding program. Tom's new bull bred 12 females in herd and several months later two calves were born that did not have any hair on their inner legs. One calf did not have hair in the belt and visible pink skin was present.

In those early years when symptomatic calves were born, the sire was faulted. But what Tom and Pete did not know was that both the sire and dam of a calf must possess the (HY) gene for the calf to exhibit hypotrichosis symptoms. Today a breeder like Tom is able to test his herd to identify known carriers of the recessive trait. And Pete is able to test both the sire and dam of the bull he sold to determine the source of the (HY) gene carrier.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### What is the procedure for requesting testing?

Requests are submitted to the Executive Director via the online form at beltie.org or via email with the required information: animals, name/registration number, if registered; some form of a unique ID (name or tattoo is best) if unregistered. Also required: sex; birthdate; sire name and registration number; dam name and registration number; plus the name and address of the member who is requesting the test/their designated representative. The Executive Director will use the information to generate the UC Davis paperwork and it will be forwarded by email to the individual requesting the test. Instructions for collecting and submitting the hair sample along with payment information will be included. Please note that hair that has previously been submitted for DNA parentage is on file at UC Davis and can be tested for hypotrichosis.


UC Davis will send the results to the Executive Director's office and the report will be forwarded to the member/representative requesting the test and the registrar's office.

#### What are the fees for hypotrichosis and DNA parentage testing?

Hypotrichosis testing is \$30 and DNA parentage testing is \$45 which may be requested in combination or separately. Animals can be tested before they are registered. Hypotrichosis testing is mandatory in bulls being registered, donor females and ET calves being registered.


Explain the probability of a calf born to two carriers of the hypotrichosis (HY) recessive gene. Also, if a non-carrier animal is bred to a (HY) recessive gene carrier animalwhat is the likelihood of their progeny carrying the gene? When two animals are mated that possess the recessive (HY) gene, progeny have a twenty-five percent probability of being afflicted/symptomatic. Half of their progeny will potentially carry the (HY) recessive gene. Progeny of a non-carrier animal bred to an animal that carries the recessive (HY) gene have a fifty percent probability of carrying the gene, and zero probability of exhibiting signs of the condition. Hypotrichosis testing is a diagnostic tool to aid breeders to make informed breeding decisions regarding animals that carry the (HY) recessive gene. ## 2025 SHOW RULES

#### SOCIETY SANCTIONED SHOW RULES

To be eligible and recognized for Belted Galloway Society financial support and points, Belted Galloway shows must comply with the following rules.

- 1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
- 2. All animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
- Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
- Original registration or recordation will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
- 5. Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear nose rings, either temporary or permanent, and must have a lead attached to the ring whenever being led.
- 6. All bulls shown must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
- Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a breeding soundness exam, including but not limited to the progressive motility, sperm morphology and scrotal circumference performed by a licensed veterinarian.
- 8. Females that are 26 mos. or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months or older must show in cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing and registered.
- Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers and Purebred, mismarked heifers. Mismarked heifers will not be eligible for Supreme Drive.
- 10. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show which would include percentage heifers and steers.

11. Percentage heifers and percentage steers may not be shown in group classes. 12. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls and group classes, followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred, mis-marked heifers and percentage heifers.

#### Group classes:

- a. Only purebred, Belted Galloways can be shown in group classes, no percentage animals, steers are allowed.
- b. There will be 3 group classes, Get of Sire, (3 animals by one sire both sexes represented) Produce of Dam, (2 animals by one dam), and Best Four Head (aka Breeder's Herd) which will consist of 4 animals represented in any configuration. All animals shown in groups must have been shown in previous classes.
- c. All animals shown in the Best Four Head (Breeder's Herd) group class must all be bred by the same breeder. Animals in this group must be owned or coowned by the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to show and the same owner's name needs to be present on registration paper as well as bred by the Group classes need to be declared at time of check in.
- 13. Grand and Reserve Grand Heifers and Bulls will be DNA verified at the Society's expense at the National show at the NAILE only. DNA verification is not required by the Society at any other shows.
- 14. To compete in the Junior Show and Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. This includes any alternate show person entering the ring for the junior. No bulls over 7 months of age may be used in Junior Showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the Judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
- 15. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions must be made by the late entry deadline of the show. Substitutions may be made within class only.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or split classes depending upon total entries in the class.

## 2025 SHOW RULES

#### SOCIETY SANCTIONED SHOW RULES

- 17. The Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injections of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation; any additions of artificial tail heads or polls; any surgical alteration of the animal's shape; as well as any dyeing or coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping or drenching) is strictly prohibited.
- 18. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
- 19. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show Committee. Cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by

- the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
- 20. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
- 21. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
- 22. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc., and of the show they are attending, or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall not be allowed back the next year.
- 23. Exhibitors time Slots for set up will be communicated to Exhibitors.
- 24. Unattended animals must be double tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.

## BELTED GALLOWAY

#### PEDIGREE TERMINOLOGY

With our change to Digital Beef there will be lots of things that will look different. We want to keep you in the know and make sure you understand. One of those things that will be different is the "Classification" section on an animal's information page. There are 3 possible terms that you can see in this section; Fullblood, Purebred and Percentage. Those words are defined as follows:

**Fullblood** - Full blood cattle are fully pedigreed animals, where every ancestor is registered in the herdbook and shows the typical characteristics of the breed. No percentages, non-Belted Galloways are in that animal's pedigree.

**Purebred** - Purebred cattle have percentage animals in the pedigree and have been bred up to purebred status. Purebred can never be fullblood or create a fullblood offspring.

**Percentage** - Percentage cattle have a breed or breeds other than Belted Galloway in its pedigree and are still under the needed generations to be recorded as purebred. Percentage cattle need to be at least 50% percent Belted Galloway (sire or dam was a registered Belted Galloway).

**Registration papers:** With Digital Beef you will have the option to have your registration papers printed and mailed to you or not. As a reminder if you are planning on showing your animal most shows do ask for a paper copy of a registration. Registration papers will look a little different. They will be color coded with a red border indicating an animal that is fullblood or purebred and a green border indicating a percentage recorded animal.
