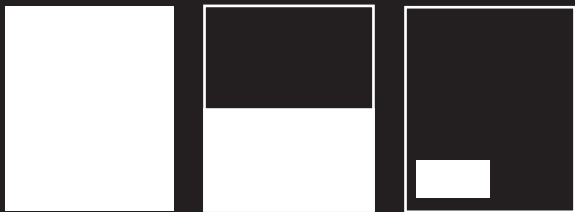
## OUR VALUES

# WORLD GALLOWAY CONFERENCE

AUGUST 2ND-11TH, 2027



Plans are well underway for the World Galloway Congress 2027, and we're thrilled to share an early look at what promises to be an unforgettable event! Next year marks a truly special occasion — the 150th anniversary of The Galloway Cattle Society of Great Britain and Ireland — and we can't wait to celebrate this milestone with Galloway enthusiasts from around the world.

## Starting in Northern Ireland

The tour begins in Belfast on Monday, 2nd August 2027, with registration followed by a private tour of the Titanic Exhibition and a welcome dinner in the stunning Titanic Quarter. Over the next few days, we'll visit four exceptional farms, showcasing both Black and Belted Galloways. Delegates will also have the chance to explore some of Northern Ireland's most famous landmarks — from the dramatic Giant's Causeway to the fascinating Ulster American Folk Park in Omagh.

Next, we'll journey into the beautiful Lake District, where farm visits will highlight how Galloway cattle play a vital role in conservation and countryside regeneration. A lake steamer cruise will round off our time in this breathtaking region.

From there, we move east to Northumberland, rich in Roman history, for more farm visits featuring Black and Belted Galloways in their natural settings.

## The Grand Finale

Our final day, Wednesday, 11th August, takes us to South West Scotland, visiting two exceptional herds not featured in the 2016 Congress — both highly regarded in the sale rings at Castle Douglas and Carlisle. We'll finish the tour in style with a Farewell Gala Dinner, celebrating new friendships, shared experiences, and our beloved Galloway breed.



Delegates can choose to join the full tour, or take part in either the Northern Ireland or Great Britain segments — with more details to follow soon.

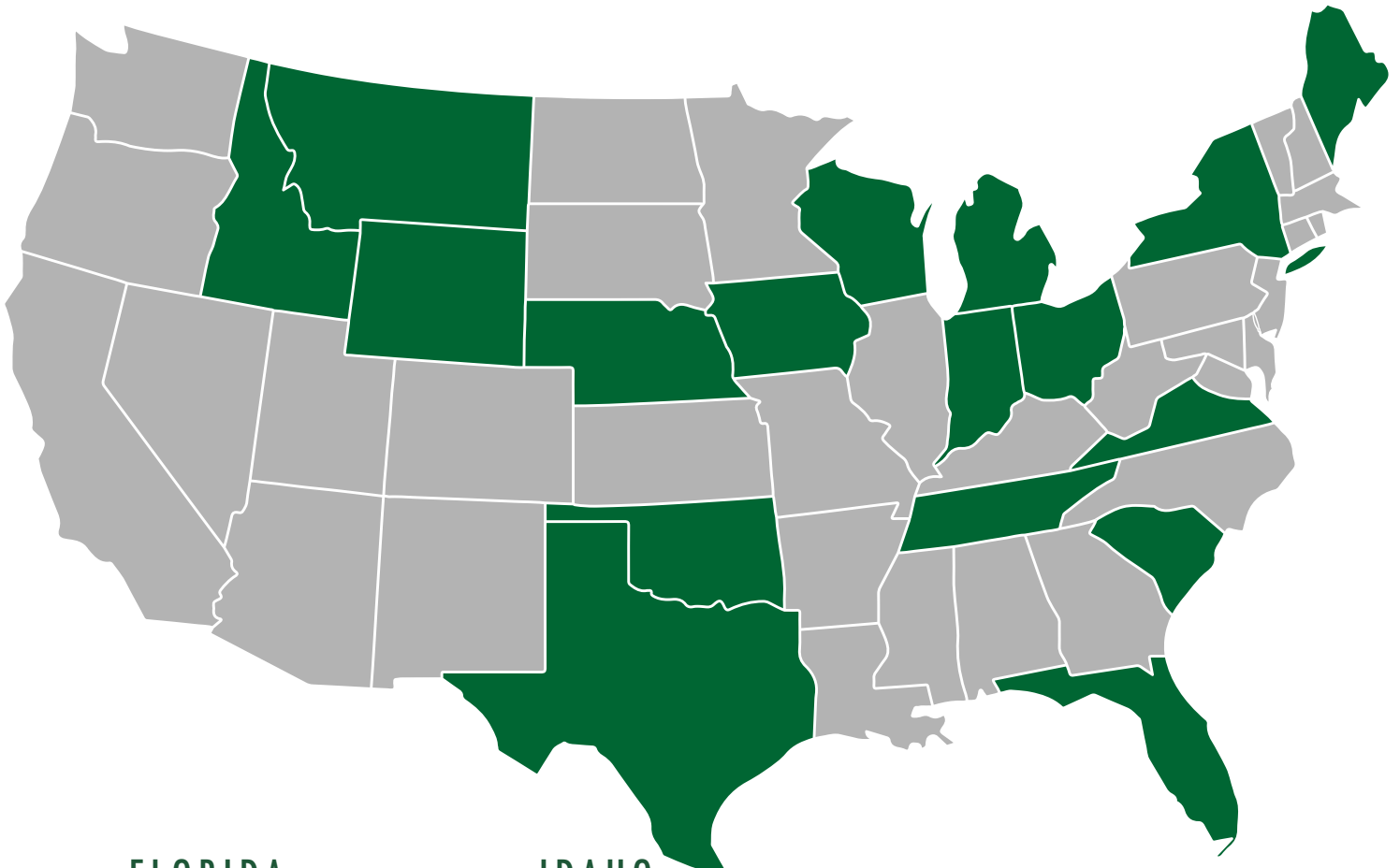

# TATTOOING CATTLE

## FOR PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION

The Society's rules since January 1996, have required that ALL Belted Galloways be tattooed in the left ear (or optionally both ears) before registration or recordation. Proper identification at birth and legible tattoos are essential to maintaining accurate parentage and production records. As a reminder, a readable tattoo is a requirement with the Belted Galloway Society.

Tattooing can be done any time before registering, although it's best done when the animals are young. Twig Mason, director of the Northeast Extension and Research Center and professor of ruminant nutrition for the University of Nebraska, recommends tattooing calves before 3 months of age. "The younger you tattoo a calf, the more legible the tattoo will be," says Twig. "The tattoo will grow as the calf gets older, making it easier to read."

Twig says successful tattooing is a result of proper technique and the completion of a series of steps. Here are some steps that can be taken to help ensure a legible tattoo.

### Proper equipment

Success starts with having the necessary tattooing equipment. Before beginning, a breeder should have a complete set of number and letter characters. Sets of tattoo characters have one of each number (0-9) and letter (A-Z), so you may have to purchase more than one set. Tattoo equipment can be purchased from a livestock supply dealer.

Remember that both the farm tattoo code and the tattoo number and year designation need to be tattooed and legible.

There are a variety of different types of tattoo pliers, which use removable digits, on the market. Some pliers have revolving heads and will hold two different tattoos at once. You'll need a rag or a sponge and some rubbing alcohol to clean out the ear before you apply the tattoo.

Tattoo ink, green works best with Belted Galloways, is critical in getting a readable and permanent tattoo. With the aid of a toothbrush, the ink can be worked into a fresh tattoo easily.

A good working chute is also critical to a legible tattoo. The chute

should restrain the animal from making quick head movements. "The only stress on the animal during the tattoo process comes from poor restraint," Twig says. "For a readable tattoo to happen, the animal must hold still and be kept from moving its head."

### Ready to begin

Once you have the calf in the working chute, check your records and establish the tattoo that will identify the calf. Place the corresponding digits in your pliers. Twig suggests checking the tattoo on something like a piece of cardboard or an old feed sack. Otherwise, you run the risk of incorrectly tattooing the calf.

Check to make sure that all of your digits make an even perforation. One common mistake breeders make is not throwing away dull, broken or hair-matted characters. Such digits do not allow for deep penetration into the ear tissue.

Cleaning the ear and ridding it of all wax and dirt in the next step. Twig says the key to a good tattoo is a clean ear. "To really do a good job, you need to clean out that ear with alcohol," Twig stresses. "You can't get a tattoo to take with all the wax and dirt that is normally in the ear."

The ear should be dry before moving on to the next step - applying ink. The recommendation is to tattoo the animal in the upper two-thirds of the lobe. Try to ensure that the tattoo is stamped in the center of the ear, close to the head, not the tip or the end of the ear. Tattoos should be placed where the skin is lightest in color and free from hair. Be sure to avoid ribs or cords in the ear, as placing the tattoo in one of these ribs means a poor tattoo as well as an excessive flow of blood.

**The Society reminds members that tattoos are recorded on the animal's certificate and needs to accurately reflect which ear tattoos are found in (RE or LE).**

Before tattooing the animal, rub the ink in with a toothbrush or your thumb. By doing this, the ink will more likely be carried into the new tattoo.

# TATTOOING CATTLE

## FOR PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION

When ready to proceed, place the ear between the jaws of the pliers. It's important when clamping the pliers to use the right amount of pressure.

"Close the jaws quickly and firmly and release quickly to avoid tearing the ear," says Twig. "Use enough pressure that it pierces the skin, but don't go so deeply that it bleeds profusely."

The only way to stop an ear from bleeding after the use of too much pressure is to reapply ink. Twig points out. Put on more ink and use that toothbrush to get the ink down in those perforations. The ink helps the blood coagulate.

Make sure that the ink is worked thoroughly into the tattoo to ensure a legible and permanent tattoo mark. When the tattooing princess is finished, clean the characters to remove all hair, dirt and blood. This is also the time when you should throw away and get replacements for the ones that are dull.

### When to tattoo

There are advantages and disadvantages to tattooing at birth or the alternative, waiting to tattoo calves as a group. Regardless of your choice, precaution to avoid human error is imperative.

### Imperfect tattoos

The Society recommends checking all tattoos at weaning or any other time an animal is in the chute. Tattoos are not always perfect. Two frequent causes of imperfect tattoos are poor technique and, for breeders calving during the cold months, frozen ears. Frozen ears can be minimized through different management practices from using neck warmers, to warming shelters, etc.

### Establishing a herd ID system

Before tattooing, an effective and well-planned herd identification system should be established. This system should benefit the producer and make herd recordkeeping easier.

Depending on a breeder's needs, a tattoo can reflect several different things. The tattoo can relate a number in a sequence as to when the calf was born, or refer to the offspring's parents, regardless of that choice the international letter code system must also be used within the tattoo.

The international letter code system, where a letter represents the year a calf was born, has become popular worldwide. P is the letter producers are using to represent 2026. The letter N was used for 2025. With this system the letters I, O, V and Q are not used.

Breeders need to develop a tattoo system that fits their needs, avoids duplications and follows the rules of tattooing with the Society.

### Buying and/or selling cattle and tattoos

A reminder that buyers of registered Belted Galloways should be asking about and checking for tattoos. Sellers of registered Belted Galloways should be ensuring tattoos are accurate and legible for buyers to view. Tattoo issues should be brought to the attention of the Executive Director when identified.

# 2026 SHOW RULES

## SOCIETY SANCTIONED SHOW RULES

To be eligible and recognized for Belted Galloway Society financial support and points, Belted Galloway shows must comply with the following rules.

1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
2. All animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book.
3. Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
4. Original registration or recordation will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo at time of check in will not be allowed to show. Tattoos must match registration/recordation papers.
5. Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear nose rings, either temporary or permanent, and must have a lead attached to the ring whenever being led.
6. All bulls shown must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
7. Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a breeding soundness exam, including but not limited to the progressive motility, sperm morphology and scrotal circumference performed by a licensed veterinarian.
8. Females that are 26 mos. or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months or older must show in cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing and registered. There will only be 1 cow/calf class regardless of cow age.
9. Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers and Purebred, mismarked heifers. Mismarked heifers will not be eligible for Supreme Drive
10. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show which would include percentage heifers and steers.
11. Percentage heifers and percentage steers may not be shown in group classes.
12. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, purebred mismarked heifers, cow/calf, bulls, purebred steers and group classes, followed by percentage steers and percentage heifers.  
Group classes:
  - a. Only purebred, Belted Galloways can be shown in group classes, no percentage animals, steers are allowed.
  - b. There will be 3 group classes, Get of Sire, (3 animals by one sire both sexes represented) Produce of Dam, (2 animals by one dam), and Best Four Head (aka Breeder's Herd) which will consist of 4 animals represented in any configuration. All animals shown in groups must have been shown in previous classes.
  - c. All animals shown in the Best Four Head (Breeder's Herd) group class must all be bred by the same breeder. Animals in this group must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to show and the same owner's name needs to be present on registration paper as well as bred by the Group classes need to be declared at time of check in.
13. Grand and Reserve Grand Heifers and Bulls will be DNA verified at the Society's expense at the National show at the NAILE only. DNA verification is not required by the Society at any other shows.
14. To compete in the Junior Show and Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. This includes any alternate show person entering the ring for the junior. No bulls over 7 months of age may be used in Junior Showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the Judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
15. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions must be made by the late entry deadline of the show. Substitutions may be made within class only.
16. The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or split classes depending upon total entries in the class.

# 2026 SHOW RULES

## SOCIETY SANCTIONED SHOW RULES

17. The Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injections of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation; any additions of artificial tail heads or polls; any surgical alteration of the animal's shape; as well as any dyeing or coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping or drenching) is strictly prohibited.

18. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.

19. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show Committee. Cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.

20. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.

21. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.

22. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc., and of the show they are attending, or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall not be allowed back the next year.

23. Exhibitors time Slots for set up will be communicated to Exhibitors.

24. Unattended animals must be double tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes

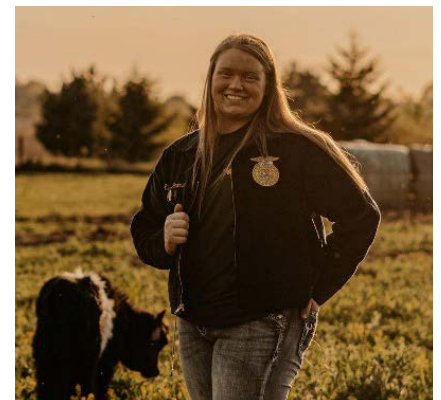

## WHOLE HERD REPORTING

### How to Complete a Herd Inventory in DigitalBeef

A herd inventory is a snapshot of the cattle you currently own that are registered with the Belted Galloway Society. Keeping it accurate ensures records, transfers, and reports reflect reality.

#### Step-by-Step: Completing Your Herd Inventory

1. Log in to DigitalBeef - Go to the DigitalBeef portal and log in using your membership credentials.
2. Access Your Herd Inventory - Navigate to "My Herd" or "Herd Inventory" from the main menu. This will display all animals currently listed under your ownership
3. Review Each Animal Carefully - Confirm animals still in your possession.  
Check:
  - Registration number
  - Name
  - Sex
  - Status (active, sold, deceased)
  - Remove Animals You No Longer Own  
If an animal has been:
  - Sold
  - Transferred
  - Harvested
  - Deceased Make sure the appropriate transfer or disposal record has been completed.
4. Verify Transfers - Ensure all animals sold have a completed transfer recorded in DigitalBeef. Incomplete transfers can leave animals incorrectly listed in your herd.
5. Add Missing Animals (if applicable)  
If an animal you own is not listed:
  - Check that registration was completed
  - Confirm ownership transfer was finalized
6. Save and Confirm - Once reviewed, confirm your herd inventory is accurate.
7. Contact Registrar - If you find any discrepancies ie. classification, DOB, ownership etc please reach out to our Registrar, Stephanie or the Executive Director, Corinna to get it corrected.

### Why a Herd Inventory Is Important

#### Accurate Breed Records

Maintaining correct ownership records protects the integrity of the Belted Galloway herdbook and ensures historical accuracy for future generations.

#### Smooth Transfers and Registrations

An up-to-date inventory prevents:

- Delays in transfers
- Registration errors
- Confusion during sales or private treaty transactions

#### Shows, Sales & Junior Eligibility

Correct ownership is essential for:

- National and regional shows
- Junior ownership and participation
- Sale catalogs and online listings

#### Breed Data & Reporting

Accurate inventories help the Society:

- Track breed numbers and trends
- Support grant applications and research
- Advocate for the breed with reliable data

#### Protects You as the Breeder

Your inventory serves as:

- Proof of ownership
- A record for insurance or farm management
- A reliable reference during audits or disputes

#### Best Practice Recommendation

Review your herd inventory at least once a year, and always after:

- Selling cattle
- Purchasing new animals
- Registering calves
- Completing transfers

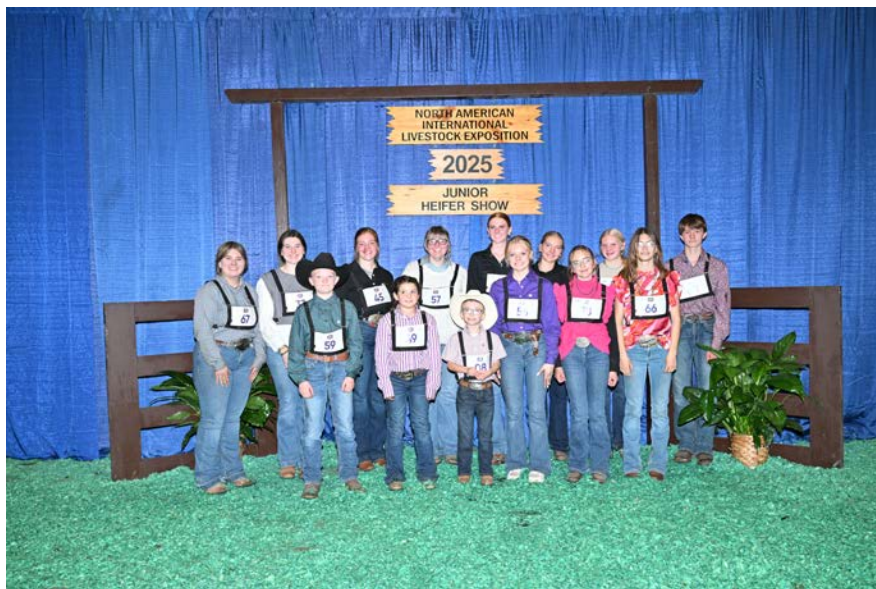

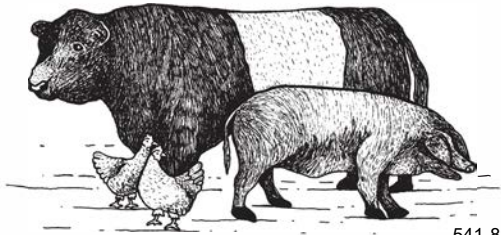
