

The 2019 Spring Council Meeting

The Spring Council meeting was called to order at 8:10 a.m. March 24, 2019, in Fredericksburg, TX by President Dawson Masters (TX). President Masters welcomed everyone to Fredericksburg and introductions of guests and Council were made. Present: Jon Bednarski (KY), Past President Greg Hipple (IA), Paul Tarap (CA), Vice-President Janie Tripp (MS), Also present was Executive Director Victor Eggleston (WI). Leanne Fogle (IL) represented the newsletter office. Absent: Jack Bagley (VA), Randy Hall (ME), Keith Jones (SC) Dick Williams (SC).

Secretary's Report. Greg Hipple communicated that membership totals during 2018 were 850 Regular, 108 Junior, 8 Associate, and 143 Life. Total memberships during 2018 were 1,109. The 2018 registration/transfer data included 215 Males, 1,110 Purebred Females, 104 Appendix/Percentage Females/Steers and 1,132 Transfers. Total transactions were 2,561.

Treasurer's Report. Jon Bednarski reported the Society has \$24,109 in checking, \$10,906 in savings, and \$158,960 in a certificate of deposit. Society assets total \$193,975. The Society has a check and balance system in place. As treasurer, Jon Bednarski reviews the monthly bank statements.

Promotion and Advertising Committee. Jon Bednarski informed Council that he is anticipating the attendance of 150-200 world-wide delegates for the 2020 World Galloway Conference to be held in November 2020 during NAILE in Louisville, KY. A video to promote the event is live and on YouTube. The itinerary is finalized, and the Society is paying deposits for various venues. A website will be available for registration. A logo has been designed. Registration fees for the delegates will be \$495 per attendee. An early bird rate will also be offered to delegates. The video and website will be linked to beltie.org. Bednarski asked the show/sale committee to work with NAILE to accommodate the delegate tour. Debby Nichols from Connections in Louisville, KY will produce the 2019 Belted Galloway Journal. The advertising campaign will begin in April 2019. Editorial is being sought for the 2019 Belted Galloway Journal.

Budget. Council approved the budget with additional budgeting funding for the World Galloway Congress. Vic Eggleston noted there may still be an outstanding balance owed to NAILE for the 2019 show that is not reflected in the budget presented. Eggleston commented that profits have increased for the past few years because of the Canadian-United States monetary exchange. Jon Bednarski reminded Council that the Belted Galloway Society is a non-profit organization.

Chatfield Scholarship Committee. Vic Eggleston reported that applications are due at the end of April 2019. Three applications have been submitted to date.

Executive Committee. The Council reviewed the contracts for the offices of the Executive Director and Newsletter. Council approved the budgeted recommendations.

The Belted Galloway Foundation. Vic Eggleston reported BGJA Area 5 applied for funding BGJA funding. A meeting of the Founda-

tion will be scheduled soon. Total Foundation funds: \$46,279. Individual fund balances include: General Fund: \$14,294; Scholarship \$12,219; Junior: \$19,766.

Belted Galloway Junior Association. Council approved the following recommendations made by chair Janie Tripp. Beginning in 2019 the junior show will use the same format as the open show and include the following divisions: purebred properly marked females, purebred mismarked females, percentage females, purebred steers, and crossbred steers. The Jackpot Steer show will be eliminated, and the committee will offer premiums for all animals at the National Junior Show. The committee will set a fundraising goal to pay premiums. The committee raised \$737.12 over expenses for the 2019 Kathi Jurkowski National Junior Show. A rule change regarding leased or owned/co-owned animals by a junior member was approved. All cattle to be exhibited by a junior member must be leased, or owned/co-owned, by the junior member, and on file with the CLRC, 60 days before the junior show.

Newsletter Committee. Leanne Fogle reported that Lifetime Awards and a How to Register a Belted Galloway bull informational page had been added to beltie.org. The BGS Twitter account has been updated and feeds from the Facebook page. Email spoofing has been done with the names of Council members in phishing and spam campaigns. Dawson Masters will address in a message within the newsletter. Junior members have been featured in the president's messages during 2019.

Show Committee. Council approved a revision of the 2019 Show Rules presented by President Dawson Masters. (Published on page 5 this issue.) The committee is having an on-going discussion regarding changing the Show Point System rules. The various regional groups were contacted. As proposals by the regions arrive, they will be referred to the Show Committee.

Sale Committee. The 2018 Belted Galloway Premium Sale gross receipts were \$53,450. Fees for conducting the 2018 Belted Galloway Sale totaled \$10,101.96. Internet bidding totaled an additional \$2,500 which was covered through private donations. Consignors were charged a 10 percent consignment fee. Council approved holding a 2019 Belted Galloway Premium Sale and hiring Mike Jones (GA) as sales manager.

New Business.

- $1. \;\;$ Council approved a \$1000 funding request for the NEGG National Sale.
- 2. Councilman Paul Tarap and Clete Kirschbaum (WI) presented the concept of interfacing a junior board with the BGS and the BGS Foundation to create a junior program. President Masters formed an exploratory committee for this purpose. Council asked the committee to continue working. The committee was asked to draft an article to appear in the US Beltie News asking if there is interest in starting a junior national. The article will also ask for nominations from regions to establish a junior board.

This is a summary of committee reports at the Council meeting of the Belted Galloway Society. The official minutes are on file with the Executive Director.

Transferring an Animal to a New Owner

The original registration certificate MUST accompany the transfer paperwork when sent to the CLRC. The fee is \$20 if the transfer is made within 30 days of the sale.



2019 Louisville Belted Galloway Show Rules

- NAILE will collect an entry fee of \$50/head entered and \$15 for Junior showmanship. Entries should be made through NAILE online system at livestockexpo.com or mail entry forms to NAILE, P. O. Box 37130, Louisville, KY 40233.
- Exhibitors must be members in good standing with the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
- Animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
- Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
- Original registration or recordation papers will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
- Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear a nose ring, either temporary or permanent and must have a lead attached when being lead.
- All bulls exhibited must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchid bull will be allowed.
- Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting that they have passed a bull soundness exam
- Heifers exhibited born January 1, 2018 or later can be shown open, heifers born December 31, 2017 or earlier must have a certificate of pregnancy by a licensed veterinarian or verified by an accredited pregnancy blood test, or accompanied by an original certificate of embryo recovery, in order to show.
- 10. Females that are 30 months or older must show in the cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age.
- 11. Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls, purebred steers and purebred mis-marked heifers.
- 12. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway Show which would include percentage heifers and steers.
- 13. The show order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls, group classes followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred, mis-marked heifers and percentage heifers.
- 14. Group classes:
 - A. Only purebred properly marked Belted Galloway heifers and bulls can be shown in group classes.
 - B. All animals shown in the Breeders Herd group class must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor at least 30 days prior

to the show.

C. There will only be 3 group classes, Get of Sire, Produce of Dam and Breeders Herd, which will consist of 4 animals represented in any configuration.

- All Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals shall be DNA verified at the Society's expense.
- 16. To compete in Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. No bulls over 7 months of age may be used in showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
- 17. The show committee reserves the right to split over-enrolled classes and combine under-enrolled classes.
- 8. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another, no new fees are required, however registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions must be made by November 1. Substitutions may be made within class only. See General Rule 14 on page 14.
- 19. The show committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation, any additions of artificial tail heads or polls, any surgical alteration of animal's shape, as well as any dyeing with coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.
- 20. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minute of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
- 21. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show committee. Cost of any investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
- 22. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
- 23. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
- 24. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc and the North American International Livestock Exposition or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall not be allowed back the next year.
- 25. Exhibitors will be able to set up (time and date)
- Unattended animals must be double-tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.
- All animals will be required to be weighed and measured. No exceptions.
