

### **Great Lakes Holds a Great Event**

The Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association held our field day in Mauston, Wisconsin this year. Our host was John Hamm of Wisconsin River Meats. The day began with a discussion on the importance of maintaining records on the farm or ranch. Terry Willis discussed the primary reasons for keeping records such as managing finances; maintain quality and quality assurance, and enabling you to make the right decisions for your herd with your goals in mind.

John Hamm discussed strategies for direct marketing your belted Galloway beef. John has spent much of his career direct marketing beef and meats and knows the ins and outs of direct marketing. Some of John's key points included: do not compete with the grocery store prices, because you don't have the scale; and you are selling a product that has different attributes and therefore should be marketed at a price point commensurate with those attributes. John also mentioned that establishing and maintaining a base of customers is the key to direct marketing. By producing a consistent product and selling it to a consistent customer base over time will enable your direct marketing efforts to be success-

The field day also included a carcass contest. Those who attended were able to see how the beef was processed, graded, prepared for retail sale, and judged. There were ten entries and categories included both grass and grain fed. During the tour of Wisconsin River Meats, participants were able to participate in the carcass evaluation and judging. A prize was offered for the person who judged in line with the University Extension Agent. Matt Sewell, from Kansas, won by judging the closest.

John Hamm supplied a fantastic barbequed brisket lunch and then

toured John's herd of Belties. After lunch, the bus left for Mount Haven, to a Belted Galloway farm owned by Former Wisconsin Governor and Secretary of Health and Human Services, Tommy Thompson and his partners Scott and Sheri Schultz. The farm was beautiful and representative of the driftless area of Wisconsin with rolling hills. The farm pastured 57 Belted Galloway cattle. The tour included a review of the farm and Tommy's homestead.

We returned to Wisconsin River Meats, where Bernice O'Rourke, A UW Madison Livestock Specialist and Alana Voss, Extension Agricultural Educator, Juneau, and Sauk County, announced the results of the carcass contest and reviewed the details explaining how carcass quality is judged. Following the educational session, John served up a prime rib dinner with all the sides. Tommy Thompson joined us for the meal and greeted all the participants.

The evening closed with an auction held for the Belted Galloway Junior Association. John Hamm played the role of the auctioneer and did a great job. The members of the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association showed their spirit and support with some excellent competitive bidding. Total proceeds for our juniors approached \$2,000.

On a special note of recognition, the Great Lakes Belted Gallo-

way Association was founded in 1992. Since then it has hosted many field days. Mel and Sparky Mieske (at left) have attended every one of them except for one. Plus they were meeting hosts not once, but twice! Their commitment to the breed and continuous learning is a lesson for all of us.

We would also like to extend a special thank you to John Hamm and the staff at Wisconsin River Meats. Their hospitality and generosity were appreciated by all 40 members who participated in the event. Members came from all over the

country to attend the event, and John and the Wisconsin River Meats staff made the whole group feel welcomed. Another fantastic field day is in the books.

The second Belted Galloway carcass contest was held during the Great Lakes Belted Galloway field day. The ten carcasses were processed at Wisconsin River Meats in Mauston, WI. The judge was Bernice O'Rourke, A UW Madison Livestock Specialist.

When announcing the winners of the contest, O'Rourke complimented all the entries as being high-quality, desirable carcasses. There were nine grain fed carcasses and one grass-fed carcass. It was a family affair for the winners in the grain fed division.

First and second place went to Mike, and Kathy Wagner, Tipton, IA, and the third place went to Audrey Wagner, Tipton, IA. In the grass-fed division, the winner came all the way from Maine and was raised by Andy LeMaistre.

Everyone that attended the GLBGA field days was able to view the carcasses hanging in the cooler, and Bernie O'Rourke detailed the placings and explained the data that was collected. She also explained the yield grade and quality grade factors that were used to place the carcasses. This was all tied together by John Hamm, who gave pointers on the best ways to direct market Beltie beef.



# **Updates from NAILE**

President Dawson Masters

I hope you are having a great summer. NAILE sent me a list of additional updates for 2019. I am sharing them early

with all of our 2019 exhibitors so that you can plan accordingly. Our calendar of events published in this newsletter is the most up-to-date information that we have at this time. We will continue to add hotel information and updates to beltie.org as they come in.

- All animals will enter the grounds at Gates 4 or 6. Gate 4 will be open 24/7.
- Health papers will be checked at this time. All animals must be have a valid health paper with an official identification (including transit animals).
- All beef cattle will be required to have a USDA 840 EID Tag. This includes all transit and sale cattle.
- All cattle will be required to have a BVD negative test.
   This includes all transit or sale cattle.



# Belted Galloway Junior Association Rule Change

Leased or owned/co-owned animals by a junior member was approved. All cattle to be exhibited by a junior member must be leased, or owned/co-owned, by the junior member, and on file with the CLRC, 60 days before the junior show.

## Transferring an Animal to a New Owner

The original registration certificate MUST accompany the transfer paperwork when sent to the CLRC. The fee is \$20 if the transfer is made within 30 days of the sale.





# Breed Exposure at Purina Farms

Myra and Tony Franks from BMP Farm near Rolla, Missouri were contacted again in early 2019 by Purina Farms about leasing a Belted Galloway heifer during 2019. The Franks leased a Beltie heifer, BMP Klara, to the Purina Farms Visitor Center just outside St. Louis, Missouri from March through October 2018. The Purina Farms barn area allows both adults and children to interact with a variety of domestic animals found on a typical working farm. Children who visited before 2018, would inquire if the Holsteins on display were "oreo cookie cows?" Purina

Farms opted to pursue the lease of a Belted Galloway.

The Franks' contact at Purina Farms is currently Lexie Burgett. It was initially the intent to lease BMP Liberty to the farm this year. Liberty was so named due to her birthdate of 7/4/18. After

multiple contacts with Lexie at Purina Farms Myra had the idea of calling another 2018 heifer, BMP Lexie. The Franks' felt that not everyone likes having a heifer named for them. The shared the idea with Ms. Burgett, and she excitedly approved considering it an honor.

BMP Lexie, 44309-B, is on display in the barn during regular visiting hours through October. Purina Farms has increased pasture access for the large animals in their care this season. Pictured is BMP Lexie and one of her companions Sara Sue on pasture at Purina Farms.

BMP Farm is a 141-acre farm just 5 miles north of I-44 at Rolla, Missouri. The farm is current-

ly home to 47 head of Belted Galloway cattle and sells registered breeding stock and freezer beef. The Franks are committed to promoting the Belted Galloway breed as well as their small farming endeavor.
